The talk offers a brief history of the genre, contextualising it within the rise of climate action and the development of climate criticism in literary studies. It traces the growing awareness of global warming over the last century and current debates around the Anthropocene. Along the way, it questions how climate fiction is defined and how narrative forms have adapted to address climate change. It concludes by asking whether the urgency of the climate crisis makes climate fiction not only an innovative genre but a boundary case for literature itself—raising key questions about the political, aesthetic, and educational roles of literature in the age of climate crisis.
